



BALI

The urban atmosphere of Denpasar, Bali's bustling capital city - as well as business and administrative hub -, contrasts sharply with the serene Hindu temples, green terraced rice fields and superb sandy beaches nearby. Denpasar is a cosmopolitan, modern city that has grown rapidly in the past three decades and in many ways it has more in common with other Indonesian regional capitals than with its island hinterland. Nevertheless, it is worth a visit, even if you prefer to stay in one of the resort areas nearby rather than in the city itself.











ESSENTIAL INFORMATION



POST

Stamps and envelopes can be bought at the concierge desks of all hotels, and this is a much more convenient option than using public post offices. The main post office on the island is located in Denpasar but there are also smaller outlets in most of the bigger towns around the island.

PHARMACY

You can find several different pharmacies on all the different tourist destinations and bigger cities on Bali. The Balinese call them "apoteks" and the biggest chain is Kimia Farma. Before you buy any products take a look at the expiry date since they can be out of date.

NGURAH RAI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Bali Ngurah Rai International Airport is 13 km west of Denpasar.

Facilities include shops, bar and restaurant, currency exchange, post office, internet access, tourist information office, tour agency, car hire, duty-free shops and VIP lounges.

The best way to get to your hotel from the airport is by taxi. Many resort hotels often offer complimentary minivan or limousine transfers.Taxis, deluxe taxis and bemos (mini-vans) are also available and you find them outside the terminal on the right hand side. Buy a fixed price ticket to your hotel. To Seminyak the fare starts at 60,000rp, to Legian 55,000rp, Ubud 195,000rp Nusa Dua 95,000rp, Kuta (Discovery) 45,000rp and Denpasar from 70,000rp. All prices are per taxi, not per person.



PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Numerous bemos (minibuses) operate on fixed routes around the city and the rest of the island, leaving when full and stopping anywhere on their route on request. Most foreigners find the system confusing and find haggling over fares challenging. There are also buses connecting the bigger cities around the island, operating mostly daytime. Both buses and bemos can be stopped anywhere along their routes.

TAXI

Blue and yellow city taxis can be hailed on the street, at numerous taxi ranks, or called from your hotel or restaurant. They are cheap, by international standards and are much more convenient than bemos. However, be prepared to haggle over fares as taxi meters have failed to keep pace with inflation. Hiring a taxi with a driver can be a good option since the prices are low. Many drivers speak a little English. One of the biggest taxi companies on the island is Bali Taksi &Golden Bird by PT Blue Birds.

TRADITIONAL MUSIC AND DANCE

No visitor should miss Bali's many traditional joged and legong dances, barong performances, or excerpts from the great Hindu dance-drama, the Ramayana. Most large hotels stage performances (open to non-residents as well as residents) nightly. For barong, also head for the open-air performances held every morning at Batubulan, northeast of the city centre. Wayang kulit (shadow puppet) shows are also performed frequently at many hotels and art centres.

Bali is famed for its rich and several centuries old musical heritage and SMKI is dedicated to keeping these traditions alive in the 21st century. Visit SMKI in the morning (from 08.00-11.00) to watch dance teachers pass on their skills to a new generation of students.





SHOPPING



The epicentre of shopping in Denpasar is the huge, riverside Pasar Badung. On the opposite bank of the river, you will find the Kumbasari Complex.

For international-style retailing, Denpasar also has numerous modern, air-conditioned malls such as New Dewata Ayu and Matahari (opposite each other on Jalan Dewi Sartika). Out of town, Sanggraha Kriya Handicrafts in the eastern suburb of Topathi (8 km from the city centre), has a huge assortment of all Bali's craft products. Prices are fixed.

However, most of the best out of the ordinary shopping in Bali is not in Denpasar, but in the nearby beach resorts of Kuta and Sanur, or in the hill resort of Ubud – all within less than an hour's drive from the city. Kuta is great for cheap beachwear and funky jewellery.
